


# SCRIPTURES

Moses spent the last years of his life in the desert wandering around with a bunch of people who complained and complained and complained and complained....

At the end of his life, he wrote Psalm 90.

He stopped and looked back over the years that he had lived and he realised that God has always and will always exist, but that human life on earth is very short.

During his time in the desert, he would've seen a lot of babies born and he would've seen a lot of his friends die. Some estimate that over 2,000,000 people died during Moses' years in the desert. Seeing all of those people born and all of those people die must have made Moses realise that human life is very short and fragile, especially compared to a great and powerful God!


We can live with hope for our future! What Jesus did when he rose from the dead was to show us that he is greater than anything; more powerful than death itself!

And more!



Repetition makes it stick!





